FACILITIES IN THE COLLEGE

LIBRARY

The college has a well-equipped library consisting of more than 28,315 volumes of books on different branches of knowledge in a spacious area of 6,000 sq.ft. There are 147 journals, magazines and weeklies which enhance the knowledge of students and keep them abreast of the latest developments in Arts, Science and Technology. Falling in line with the latest trends, the library has been computerised, which facilitates easy access to books. Browsing through Internet is provided for the students in the library. The students and scholars can do on-line access of e-journals like EBSCO, IEEB, J-Gate, N-List, etc.

LAB

The college has three spacious computer labs with adequate number of systems, softwares and accessories like printers, scanners and CD writers. All systems have colour monitors with Logitech mouse. The students of Electronics are given practical training in three well-equipped labs with all facilities. They are trained in E-COM, WAP and other programmes such as computer maintenance programme, Electronic Equipment Servicing and Designing of mini equipment like Television, Transistor, Fire alarm, Burglar alarm, Water-level indicators etc., to get better placements. The students of Catering Science and Hotel Management are exposed to practice and training through well furnished cookery lab, restaurant, housekeeping and front office.

NSS, NCC AND YOUTH RED CROSS

There are three NSS units and one NCC unit which instill the idea of social service by organising camps not only in rural areas but also in urban areas. Blood donation camps are organised to pool in life-saving blood. On important occasions and during festivals, NSS and NCC students help to regulate the traffic and assist city police.

COMMUNICATIVE ENGLISH

To acquire and strengthen the written and spoken skills in English communication, Communicative English Lab is established. The UG & PG Students should take seminar under internal assessment system which helps them to improve their communicative skills. Also the curriculum in English programme is based on communicative English.

TEACHING AIDS

To enrich and improve the knowledge of the students, video conferencing has been installed. Students can interact with subject experts through video conferencing. In addition to that other teaching aids like, LCD, DVD, TV, OHP etc., are also used.

COUNSELLING CELL

Each Department has a counselling cell to provide proper guidance, help and advice to students from time to time. The personal problems of students are sorted out through this cell. Valuable suggestions and timely advice is offered to students who are in need of counselling.

PLACEMENT CELL

The college procures good placements for students in reputed organisations through placement cell. This cell works with the individual Department placement cells to provide enviable jobs for students. The function of this cell is to arrange campus interviews and select students. Prior counselling and proper guidance is offered to enable students to come out successful in interviews.

DEPARTMENT ASSOCIATIONS

Each Department organises Seminars, Lectures by Visiting Faculty and Inter-Collegiate Meet to provide practical exposure to students in different fields of activity.

RESEARCH ASSOCIATION

The college has a Research Association, which organises many Seminars, Workshops for the benefit of M.Phil. and Ph.D. Scholars.

SPORTS COMMITTEE

The college has a Sports Committee, which helps in building good physique enabling the students to have "a sound mind in a sound body". The committee trains the students and makes them fit to participate in Inter-Collegiate Sports Meet. Every year the college conducts two Inter-Collegiate Meet - SNR Cricket Trophy and SNR Volleyball Trophy.

MANAVAR MANRAM

To bring out the latent histrionic talents of students, Manavar Manram organises cultural activities and inter-collegiate cultural extravaganza. Periodically, lectures on value-based education by eminent persons are arranged by the Manram for the benefit of the students.

INDUSTRIAL TRAINING

Each Department arranges periodical industrial visits to provide practical exposure to students, apart from the regular curriculum. These visits widen the intellectual horizon of students and facilitate them in proper completion of their project.

TUTORIAL SYSTEM

Each Department maintains tutorial records of students pertaining to their marks, academic performance, conduct and all possible details of students. This enables the students to make their learning process a fruitful one.

NEED BASED CURRICULUM

Apart from the regular curriculum, students are trained in **E-COM, WAP** and other programmes based on latest technology such as Visual Basic, Oracle, Java, Tally, Office Automation, Computer Hardware, Electronic Equipment Servicing, Internet etc., to get better placements in our country and abroad. To strengthen the written and spoken skills of students, Communicative English classes are arranged by the Department of English.

HOSTEL FACILITY

There are separate hostels for both boys and girls with adequate facilities.

ALUMNI FORUM

Each Department has Alumni Forum which meets periodically.

DAY ORDER SYSTEM

The College follows the DAY ORDER System. Days are denoted by numbers such as 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 and the Timetable is followed accordingly. The First Day order will be followed on the reopening day. The Second day order will be the next working day and so on.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. BEHAVIOUR

- a. The foremost object of education is moulding of character and the college lays great emphasis on decent behaviour of every student.
- b. Students should attend the college neatly and decently dressed. Boys can wear T-Shirts but not without collar. Girl students should come in Sarees / Salwar Kameez / Churidhar. They should not come in any other dress.
- c. Any student found guilty of offending any staff member will be dealt with seriously and if necessary, the punishment may lead to suspension or dismissal from the college.
- d. In the intervals or during the unexpected absence of the teacher concerned, students should remain silent in the class rooms.
- e. Students should not loiter in the verandhas, sit on the steps of the portico and staircases.
- f. Students are not allowed to roam about the campus when a class is cancelled. They should remain in the class room or in the library reading silently.
- g. Smoking is prohibited inside the college premises.
- h. Students who are found using drugs or in a drunken state will be summarily dismissed from the college.
- i. Students should abstain from participating in party and communal politics.
- j. Students should park their vehicles in the space meant for parking.
- k. For any function, conference, meeting or any gathering of the kind, students should get prior permission of the Principal.
- l. The Principal has the absolute right to penalize or suspend or dismiss any student found guilty of gross misconduct inside or outside the college campus.
- m. Students should attend classes well on time.
- n. Scribbling on the walls & desks or doing any other kind of damage to the college property is strictly prohibited. Students will be held responsible for any such wanton damage and they will be severely penalized.
- o. Students are directed to keep their cell phones in the switch off mode in the classroom.**
- P. Students are not allowed to bring cell phones to the examination hall.**

2. RAGGING AND ITS CONSEQUENCES

- a. According to Act No. 7 of 1997 of the Tamil Nadu Prohibition of Ragging Act, ragging in educational institutions in the State of Tamilnadu, is prohibited.

b. DEFINITION

According to this Act, 'ragging' means display of noisy, disorderly conduct, doing any act which causes or is likely to cause physical or psychological harm or raise apprehension or fear, shame or embarrassment to a student in any educational institution and includes

- i. teasing, abusing or playing practical jokes on or causing hurt to such student: or
- ii. asking the student to do any act or perform something which such student will not in the ordinary course willingly do.

c. PROHIBITION OF RAGGING

Ragging within or without any educational institution is prohibited.

d. PENALTY FOR RAGGING

Whoever directly or indirectly commits, participates in, abets or propagates "ragging" without or within any educational institution, shall be punished with imprisonment for a term which may extend to two years and shall also be liable to a fine which may extend to ten thousand rupees.

e. DISMISSAL OF A STUDENT

Any student convicted of an offence under section 4 shall also be dismissed from the educational institution and such student shall not be admitted in any other educational institution.

f. SUSPENSION OF A STUDENT

- i. Without prejudice to the foregoing provisions, whenever any student complains of ragging to the Head of an educational institution, or to any other person responsible for management of the educational institution, such head of the educational institution, or person responsible for the management of the educational institution shall enquire into the same immediately, and if found true, shall suspend the student, who has committed the offence, from the educational institution.
- ii. The decision of the Head of the educational institution or the person responsible for the management of the educational institution for any student who has indulged in ragging under Sub-Section (1) shall be final.

g. DEEMED ABETMENT

- i. If the head of the educational institution or the person responsible for the management of the educational institution fails or neglects to take action in the manner specified in sub-section (1) of section 6 when a complaint of ragging is made such person shall be deemed to have abetted the offence of ragging and shall be punished as provided for in section 4.
- ii. Apart from the stringent Govt. orders, ragging is an uncivilized and reprehensible act which causes severe physical and mental agony to the victim. This unsocial action which has degenerated into such sadistic dimensions that it is the duty of every cultured person to stamp it out of the educational institutions. It is hoped that all the students will extend their helping hand in rooting out this cancer.

WARNING ON RAGGING

In the light of Supreme Court's Order & Expression of Displeasure vide SLP (C) No.24295/2004, HRD Ministry's (Govt. of India) direction vide F.9-18/2008 (U-5) dated 29.4.2008 and F.9-43/ 2007-U-5, UGC's direction vide no. FI-8/2006 (CPP-II), directions from AICTE & MCI; and directions from Bharathiar University, vide NO.B3-B4/4070/2008, dt.03.04.2008 and No.B3-B4/11947/2008 dt.03.04.2008 pertaining to the curbing of ragging altogether in Educational Institutions, the college issues this order that ragging, in any form, in and around the campus is strictly prohibited. The defaulters in this regard, have to face serious consequences/severe punishment as decided by law.

3. ATTENDANCE

- a. Students should be in their seats in the respective classes before the teacher enters the class.
- b. Students coming late by five minutes or more will not be allowed to attend the class without the permission slip from the Head of the department.
- c. Absence for one or more hours during a session will be treated as absence for half a day.
- d. Calling students from the class room during the lecture hours, except with the permission slip from the Principal/HOD concerned, is prohibited.
- e. College works for 90 days per semester. Students should put in 75% of attendance (67½ days) in every semester to be eligible to appear for the Comprehensive Examination of the semester. During the semester, a student is permitted to take leave upto a maximum of 22½ days on valid reasons including medical grounds.
- f. If a student is absent for more than 22½ days, **the Principal shall have the power** to condone the shortage of attendance upto a maximum of 10% (9 days) in each semester, on valid reasons such as ill health etc., on payment of the prescribed condonation fee.
- g. In case of shortage of attendance of a student exceeding the limit prescribed for the purpose of condonation of attendance, he / she shall not be permitted to write the Comprehensive Examinations.
- h. Such students will however be permitted to continue their studies in the subsequent semester. Deficiency of the attendance of one semester shall be compensated in the subsequent semester so that the combined attendance for any two consecutive semesters will be taken into account for the eligibility of a student to be present for the examination.
- i. A student will be given only one opportunity to carry forward the deficiency in attendance of one semester to the next semester during the degree course, failing which he/she has to re-do the course.

- j. If a student is absent for more than 45 days (50%) and above, he/she will not be allowed to write the Semester Exam. Further, he/she will not be permitted to go to the next semester and he/she has to re-do the course.

4. IDENTITY CARDS

Students should have with them their identity card duly signed by the Principal. The cards will be issued to them immediately after admission to the college. They should bring their I.D. cards everyday to the College. They must be able to produce the I.D. cards on demand by the Principal or Teachers.

5. LIBRARY

- a. The Library will be kept open on all working days from 8.30 am to 5.30 pm.
- b. Strict silence should be maintained in and around the library.
- c. Students should not underline any sentence or write in the books or remove pages.
- d. Books will be issued to the students as per the following rules :
 - i. Each student will be issued two cards and each card will fetch him one book. When the book is surrendered the card will be returned to the student.
 - ii. Books should be returned on or before the due date. If a student fails to return the book on time, he/she will have to pay a fine of 50 paise for each day of delay.
 - iii. Students are responsible for the loss or damage to the library cards. If a card is lost or damaged, the student concerned shall pay a fine of Rs.10/-. The cards are not interchangeable.
 - iv. Magazines, dailies, booklets and reference books should not be taken out of the library.
 - v. Students should check the books when they receive them from the Librarian. If there is any damage it should be reported at once.
 - vi. Students should take great care of library books. If a student happens to lose any book, he / she should pay the current price of the book and a fine decided by the Principal.
 - vii. No belongings of the student like bags, personal books, bound notebooks and '**MOBILE PHONES**' will be allowed inside the library. They should be kept outside the library.
 - viii. Students before going on vacation should return the library books.

6. COLLEGE PROPERTY AND EQUIPMENT

Students are expected to take proper care of the college property and to keep the premises neat and tidy. Any damage done to the property of the college by disfiguring walls, doors, fitting, breaking furniture etc., is a breach of discipline. The students found responsible will be charged to the loss or damage.

7. MEETING OF PARENTS WITH PRINCIPAL / HOD

Parents/Guardians are requested to meet the Principal / Head of the Department periodically to know about their wards' progress in their studies and behaviour.

8. EXAMINATION

- Periodical internal tests will be conducted to assess the students to award marks for Continuous Internal Assessment.
- Students shall not leave the examination hall before forty five minutes after the commencement of the Examinations and shall not enter the hall after half an hour.
- Copying and talking with fellow students inside the examination hall are strictly prohibited. Anyone found guilty of these offences will be punished according to the rules of the College.

9. FEES PAYMENT

- The fees for each semester and Comprehensive Examinations should be paid on or before the last date announced on the notice board. The names of those who do not pay the semester fees on or before the last date will be removed from the roll.
- The Principal may consider re-admission of such students at his discretion.
- As per the instructions of the Government, the semester fee should be remitted through a DD drawn in favour of **SNR Sons College, payable at Coimbatore.**

BHARATHIAR UNIVERSITY ATTENDANCE RULES

- Proforma I : Shall contain the list of candidates who earned 75% of attendance and above in the current semester and are eligible to write the examinations.
- Proforma II : Shall contain the list of candidates who earned attendance between 65% and 74% (both included) in the current semester. These candidates are eligible to appear for the examination if the shortage of attendance is condoned by the Principal after the candidates paying the condonation fee prescribed by the University in current semester subjects.
- Proforma III : Shall contain the list of candidates who earned attendance between 50% and 64% (both included) in the current semester. Such candidates are not eligible to write the examination in current semester subjects but are permitted to continue their studies in the next semester provided that this is the first time that the candidate earned attendance between 50% and 64%. Else the candidates have to discontinue the course and re-join in the same semester in the next year with proper approval of the Registrar. However, these candidates are eligible to write arrear subjects if any.
- Proforma IV : Shall contain the list of candidates who have earned attendance below 50%. They are not eligible to write the examination in current semester subjects and also have to discontinue the course and re-join in the same semester in the next year with proper approval of the Registrar. These candidates are eligible to write arrear subjects if any.
- Proforma V : Shall contain the list of candidates who had earned attendance between 50% and 64% in the previous semester and earned combined attendance of 75% or more by taking the average of the attendance earned in current and the previous semester. These candidates are eligible to write previous semester subjects along with the current semester subjects.
- Proforma VI : Shall contain the list of candidates who had earned attendance between 50% and 64% in the previous semester and earned combined attendance between 65% and 74% by taking the average of the attendance earned in current and previous semester. Such candidates are eligible for condonation of shortage of attendance by the Principal by paying the CONDONATION FEE to the University and are eligible to write previous semester subjects along with current semester subjects.
- Proforma VII : Shall contain the list of candidates who had earned attendance between 50% and 64% in the previous semester and had earned combined attendance below 65% by taking the average of the attendance earned in the current and previous semester. Such candidates are not eligible to write the examination in previous and current semester subjects and shall discontinue the course and rejoin in the previous semester of study in the next academic year with proper approval from the Registrar.
- Proforma VIII : Shall contain the list of candidates whose names have been given in Proforma I or II or V or VI overleaf but did not register for current semester examinations (Regular subjects) with the reasons being noted.
- Proforma IX : Shall contain the consolidated list of number of candidates originally admitted and number of candidates now appearing for the current semester examination course-wise.
